Thank you for taking the time to look through this year's Oregon Department of Education report card. This year was our second year testing using the Smarter Balance Assessment. This data will be reviewed with the school leadership team and we will work to maintain areas of strength and identify areas of improvement. We have adopted a new Math curriculum at the elementary level and in our second year of a new Math curriculum at the middle school level. We have purchased a new reading intervention program, Read Naturally Live. This is an online program to replace the old Read Naturally program that was a paper/pencil program.

Teachers are the experts about what is happening in the classroom and are an invaluable resource for parents. I encourage parents to reach out to your child's teacher(s) with any questions you may have about your child's score report or academic trajectory. 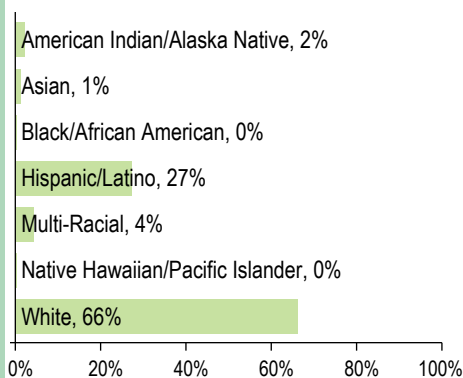

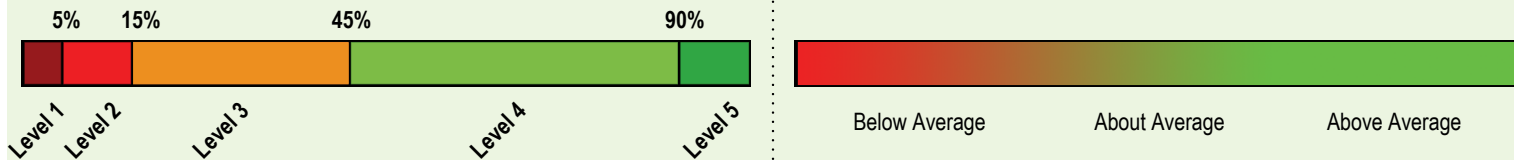
